APPLY FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

Federal Student Aid Information

Apply for Federal Student Aid online at **FAFSA.ED.GOV**. There is no fee to complete the FAFSA – if you are directed to a website that charges a fee, you have entered the web address incorrectly. The FAFSA is a FREE application. New England Culinary Institute's (NECI) school code is **015904**. **Please print a copy of your FAFSA for your records.**

The FAFSA data is used to determine your eligibility for the Federal Pell Grant, Federal SEOG Grant, Federal Work Study, Federal Stafford Loans, Federal Perkins Loan, Federal PLUS Loan, and state grant programs. Be aware that some state agencies require you to complete an additional State Grant application as well. Check with the Financial Aid Office if you are unsure about what year FAFSA you should be completing.

You may request a paper version of the FAFSA by calling toll-free at 800.433.3243. (Paper FAFSA forms generally take 4-6 weeks to process.)

NECI will send you a financial aid award letter once your federal student aid information has been processed. Since NECI offers multiple enrollment dates, financial aid processing time may vary. If you have questions about financial aid or your financial aid award letter please contact the Financial Aid Office toll-free at 877.223.6324.

Types of Federal Student Aid

Federal Pell Grant is a need-based grant that does not need to be repaid. Pell Grants are awarded to eligible students with financial need who are pursuing their first undergraduate degree. The maximum Pell Grant for 2009/10 is \$5,350.00.

Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) is a need-based grant that does not need to be repaid. FSEOG grants are awarded to eligible students who are awarded a Federal Pell Grant. Funds are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. The maximum FSEOG Grant for 2009/10 is \$750.00.

Academic Competitiveness Grant is awarded to PELL eligible students who have completed an academically rigorous high school curriculum as defined by the federal government. For more information on the Academic Competitiveness Grant please visit the Federal Student Aid website at www.studentaid.ed.gov.

Federal Work Study is awarded based on financial need. Work Study positions are posted with the Student Services Office. To learn more about NECI Work Study eligibility please contact the Financial Aid Office. Work Study is earned in the form of a bi-weekly paycheck and the award amount is not deducted from your tuition bill.

Perkins Loan awards are limited to students who would otherwise be PELL Grant eligible and already have a Bachelors degree. The maximum award amount is \$1,000.00 with a 5% interest rate. Repayment begins 9 months after a student is no longer enrolled in school at least half time.

Subsidized Stafford Loan awards are based on an eligible student's financial need. Interest does not accrue while the student is enrolled at least half time and during the 6 month grace period. The interest rate as of July 2009 is 5.6%.

Unsubsidized Stafford Loan awards are made regardless of need. Interest accrues while a student is enrolled in school. Interest can be deferred while a student is enrolled at least half time in school. The interest is capitalized (added to the principal balance) at the end of the grace period. The Unsubsidized Stafford Loan interest rate is 6%.

Parent PLUS Loan program is a borrowing option for parents of dependant undergraduate students. Financial need is not a requirement for borrowing a PLUS loan. Parents can borrow up to the cost of attendance minus financial aid. The interest rate is fixed on a PLUS loan currently at 8.5%. A positive credit history is required to obtain a PLUS loan.

APPLY FOR STATE GRANTS

Vermont residents should apply for a Vermont State Grant by visiting www.vsac.org, or by calling 802.654.3750 to request a paper application.

State grant applications are usually available after the 1st of the year and some have specific application deadlines.

Students from outside of Vermont should check with their State Higher Education Authority about the availability of state grants, eligibility requirements, and application process. New England Culinary Institute Scholarships

Academic Excellence Scholarship

The Academic Excellence Scholarship is awarded to students who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement in high school. The Academic Excellence Scholarship can be used for any term during the year following high school completion.

Criteria:

- Acceptance to New England Culinary Institute
- 3.5+ Grade Point Average
- Letter of recommendation from a high school teacher or guidance counselor

Amount: \$6,000.00 total award (\$3,000.00 per year for two years)

Number of Recipients: 10

Application Process: Please send transcript and letter of recommendation to New England Culinary Institute via fax, email, or mail indicating that you are applying for the Academic Excellence Scholarship.

Culinary Excellence Scholarship

The Culinary Excellence Scholarship is awarded to students who have participated in a high school level culinary program. The Culinary Excellence Scholarship can be used for any term during the year following high school completion.

Criteria:

- Acceptance to New England Culinary Institute
- 3.0+ Grade Point Average*
- Participation in a culinary curriculum during high school
- Letter of recommendation from your culinary instructor

Amount: \$5,000.00 total award (\$2,500.00 per year for two years)

Number of Recipients: 20

Application Process: Please send transcript and letter of recommendation to New England Culinary Institute via fax, email, or mail indicating that you are applying for the Culinary Excellence Scholarship.

*All awards made prior to the completion of high school are subject to GPA verification upon receiving final official transcript.

Vermont Culinary Preparatory Scholarship

The Vermont Culinary Preparatory Scholarship is available to Vermont students who have been recommended by their Vermont Technical Program chef instructors to participate in an online course offered by New England Culinary Institute. Upon successful completion of high school and the online coursework, students will be awarded their scholarships.

Amount: June Term — \$10,000.00
September Term — \$5,000.00

Application Process: Students are selected to participate in this program by their Vermont Technical Program chef instructors. For more information on the program, please contact the Admissions Office at admissions@neci.edu.

New Endeavors Scholarship

The New Endeavors Scholarship is available to students who are interested in pursuing a career change after at least 5 years of work in another field or profession.

Amount: \$5,000.00 total award (\$2,500.00 per year for two years)

Number of Recipients: 10

Application Process: Please send a resume and a letter describing why you are interested in pursuing a career in the culinary industry to New England Culinary Institute via fax, email, or mail indicating that you are applying for the New Endeavors Scholarship.

Life Long Learner Scholarship

The Life Long Learner Scholarship is available to students who have already completed a Bachelors degree or higher and are pursuing either a career change or exploring a passion in the culinary industry.

Amount: \$5,000.00 total award (\$2,500.00 per year for two years)

Number of Recipients: 10

Application Process: Please send a copy of your diploma or transcript and a letter describing why you have chosen to attend New England Culinary Institute via fax, email, or mail indicating that you are applying for the Life Long Learner Scholarship.

Important Note: Academic Excellence, Culinary Excellence, Vermont Culinary Preparatory, New Endeavors, and Life Long Learner Scholarships cannot be combined with one another.

Industry Professional Scholarship

The Industry Professional Scholarship is awarded to students who have professional experience in the culinary industry.

Criteria:

- 3 + years of full-time experience working in the hospitality industry
- Resume including employer contact information
- Letter of recommendation from an employer

Amount: \$5,000.00 total award (\$2,500.00 per year for two years)

Number of Recipients: 20

Application Process: Please send resume and letter of recommendation to New England Culinary Institute via fax, email, or mail indicating that you are applying for the Industry Professional Scholarship.

Alumni Referral Scholarship

If a New England Culinary Institute graduate has referred you to the school, please encourage them to visit the New England Culinary Institute Alumni website and ask them to fill out the Next Generation Scholarship form on your behalf.

Amount: \$1,000.00

Early Commitment Scholarship

The Early Commitment Scholarship is automatically awarded to students who apply and are accepted to the program by the deadlines listed below. In addition, accepted students must make a deposit commitment to attend New England Culinary Institute and sign an enrollment agreement in order to be eligible. The Early Commitment Scholarship will not be awarded to applicants who apply for a term and then wish to defer their admission to a later term.

APPLYING FOR ALTERNATIVE STUDENT LOANS

Alternative Loans (Private Education Loans)

Alternative loans are offered by private lenders and have their own eligibility criteria. Alternative loans typically have a variable interest rate that is tied to either the LIBOR or PRIME lending rate. Alternative loan fees and interest rates can vary widely – these variations are typically based on the borrower and cosigner's credit rating. Student borrowers may need to have a credit-worthy cosigner in order to obtain an alternative loan. Repayment terms and borrowing amounts can also vary. ACADEMIC TERMS AT NEW ENGLAND CULINARY INSTITUTE

An Academic Year Does Not Always Equal 12 Months

To meet accreditation requirements, all NECI programs must be designed to deliver a certain amount of coursework in a specific amount of time. This is called an *academic year*, and is not related to a 12-month calendar year.

At NECI, all associate level programs must be at least two academic years and all bachelor programs must be at least 4 academic years (including AOS level work).

At NECI, academic years are condensed, due to our intensive and year-round programs.

This allows students to qualify for Federal Financial Aid Funds more than once in a 12-month calendar year, corresponding with each academic year. Students will be billed separately for each academic year. Fees are outlined by academic year in the NECI catalog and in the enrollment agreement that each student signs.

TUITION AND FEES

Tuition Coverage

Resident Term Tuition at New England Culinary Institute covers the cost of instruction, evaluation and administrative processing during the residency, as well as membership at a local health club and use of school facilities while in the Montpelier area. The Internship Fee covers the cost of evaluation and administrative processing for the requirements associated with the internship experience. Students enrolled in elective courses in conjunction with an internship period (known as a "Non-Resident Term") will be subject to additional tuition fees and may incur additional room and board fees. Students are responsible for buying their own books, pens, paper, notebooks, laptop computer (required only for degree programs) and other school supplies. Refunds are not provided for unused materials or facilities.

Tuition Increases

New England Culinary Institute reserves the right to increase tuition, room, and board with 100 days notice before registration, when a final enrollment agreement is signed. Students will be provided an estimate of NECI-provided educational materials, such as knives and NECI supplies, at least 100 days prior to registration. Actual costs for these educational materials may vary slightly due to market cost of retail items; actual fees for these items will be available at registration. Students sign an enrollment agreement for each successive year in the culinary arts and baking & pastry arts degree programs; costs may vary between years.

Student Accounts

Any student who fails to comply with the school's payment schedule or other written payment arrangements, or who does not pay library fines or other miscellaneous charges, may be dismissed from the program or prohibited from graduating.

Health Insurance

All students will be asked to provide proof of health insurance. If a student is not insured, they will be required to select a health insurance option through NECI.

Uniforms

Dining room uniforms are the responsibility of the student.

Payment Schedule

The \$500 deposit for the student's enrollment is due 90 days prior to the start of each term. The enrollment deposit secures the student's place in the program and guarantees enrollment once all fees are paid. \$150 of the enrollment deposit is non-refundable.

The final tuition payment plan for tuition, room/board (on campus), required board (off campus), course guides, knives, dormitory damage deposit, and library deposit for the academic year is due two weeks before registration day. The final payment for the Online Bachelors Degree in Hospitality & Restaurant Management is due the Friday before the course starts for the first session. Please note that the amount of financial aid received will be deducted from this payment.

In addition to program-specific fees, other fees may be assessed for make-up work, special testing, and reinstatement after termination of enrollment.
